After the Prayer, Pledge and Roll Call, Mayor Greenlee called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The Mayor moved onto the first order of business, the approval of the minutes from the March 5, 2018 Council meeting. A motion for the approval of Minutes from March 5, 2018 Council Meeting was made by Councilmember Parks, with a second from Vice Mayor Roberts. No further discussion. Motion Carried.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

A member of the audience stated that both Williston and Chiefland honor the students of the month at the Council meetings, and wanted to know the reason the Bronson Council does not honor the students. Councilmember Parks stated that the Town has not received the names from the school, but at one time the Town did honor the students. Councilmember Parks stated that she would reach out to the schools to try again.

Mr. Elijah Williams approached the podium to express to Council what a good job the staff is doing on keeping the cemetery grounds kept up. He went to say it has been around two years since the registry books have been out at the cemetery. Vice Mayor Roberts stated that the staff has looked into the books and are trying to come up a solution for the problems. He stated that the ones that were at the cemetery were just pages.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mayor Greenlee moved into new business of Resolution 18-03: Capital City Bank, line of credit authorization. The clerk explained the Line of Credit was for the SCOP grant the amount of the grant is for \$375,000, the Resolution also gives permission for the Mayor and the Clerk to sign the required documents. A motion to accept Resolution 18-03 was made by Vice Mayor Roberts, Councilmember Parks wanted to mention that the SCOP grant would be covering everything except the \$3,250 for doc fees and origination fee. A second to the motion was made by Councilmember Parks. A question was asked from the audience if a quote or information was received from any other banks. The Clerk explained that Capital City Bank had done the last Line of Credit for a SCOP project, so the Town continued with Capital City. The vote was cast with all Councilmembers voting in favor. Motion Passed.

The Mayor moved onto the next order of business the Mittauer Picnic Street Final Proposal for the paving and sidewalk project that will be covered under the SCOP project. Mayor Greenlee asked if the Council had any input. A motion was made by Vice Mayor Roberts made a motion to accept the plans and submit. A question was asked by an audience member how much the charge from Mittauer was the services. The Clerk did not have the project submittal documents at the meeting. The charge for the service was around \$36,000. The Mayor stated that with most projects the Engineer work on are usually around 10%, a second for this motion was made by Councilmember Hunt. Motion Carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Councilmember Hunt brought up the topic of the second sign quote. He mentioned the cost was \$3, 805.54 which includes tax, however the tax would be removed once they have a copy of the Tax Exempt certificate for the Town. He stated it was a 6 x 6 sign, and the company is located in Gainesville. Councilmember Hunt stated that rough estimate for the installation was for \$735.00 for all of the signs. He stated that if the Eagle that Councilmember Parks suggested wanted to be added it was possibly. A motion accept the quote from Signs by Tomorrow in the amount of \$4308.28 was made by Councilmember Hunt, a second was made by Councilmember Parks. Motion Carried.

Councilmember Katie Parks- wanted to remind everyone that the Blueberry pageant would be May 12, 2018, the parade would be May 18, 2018 at 6:30pm and the Festival would be May 19, 2018, and the forms for participation would be available shortly.

Vice Mayor Beatrice Roberts- wanted to mention the SRLC of meeting. Vice Mayor Roberts mentioned the various representatives that were present at the event. She went on to explain various programs such as CDBG that funds have been cut and that money funneled into other programs. She went to mention that the SCOP grant had more funding available for those programs.

Councilmember Jason Hunt- wanted to mention the recent storm and the problem of the traffic light being out of power and the dangerous situation that could occur because of it. He wanted to bring up the possibility of getting a generator dedicated for the light. Mayor Greenlee stated that it would be possibility for coordination with the county.

Mayor Bruce Greenlee- just wanted to express his appreciation for those who show up the meetings and show an interest.

REVIEW AND PAY BILLS:

A motion to pay the bills as presented was made by Vice Mayor Roberts, with a second from Councilmember Parks. Motion Carried.
