REDUCE PERMIT FEES**

**WHEREAS** the 1994 Legislature enacted Chapter 218.075, Florida Statutes, allowing reduction of permit processing fees for counties with a population of 50,000 or less on April 1, 1994, until such counties exceed a population of 75,000 and municipalities with a population of 25,000 or less, or any county or municipal not included within a metropolitan statistical area upon certification by that county or city that the cost of the permit processing fee is a fiscal hardship; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Bronson has a population of 957, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Bronson certifies that it qualifies for permit processing fee reduction for the Fiscal Year October 1, 2002, through September 30, 2003 due to the following factor:

- (1) Per capita taxable value is less than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (2) Percentage of assessed property value that is exempt from ad valorem taxation is higher than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (3) Any condition specified in Section 218.503, Florida Statutes, that determines a state of financial emergency;
- (4) Ad valorem operating millage rate for the current fiscal year is greater than 8 mills; or
- (5) A financial condition that is documented in annual financial statements at the end of the current fiscal year and indicates an inability to pay the permit processing fee during that fiscal year.

**WHEREAS**, these factors are supported by the attached documents;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the Town of Bronson does hereby request that the Department of Environmental Protection reduce the processing fee for public purpose projects to a fee not to exceed \$100 per permit of the 2002-2003 Fiscal Year.

WATER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT TO  
REDUCE PERMIT FEES**

**WHEREAS** the 1994 Legislature enacted Chapter 218.075, Florida Statutes, allowing reduction of permit processing fees for counties with a population of 50,000 or less on April 1, 1994, until such counties exceed a population of 75,000 and municipalities with a population of 25,000 or less, or any county or municipality not included within a metropolitan statistical area upon certification by that county or city that the cost of the permit processing fee is a fiscal hardship; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Board of the Suwannee River Water Management District has adopted section 40B-1.706(3), Florida Administrative Code, to implement Chapter 218.075, Florida Statutes, regarding reduction of fees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Bronson has a population of 966, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Bronson certifies that it qualifies for permit processing fee reduction for the Fiscal year October 1, 2003, through September 30, 2004, due to the following factor:

(1) Per capita taxable value is less than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;

(2) Percentage of assessed property value that is exempt from ad valorem taxation is higher than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;

(3) Any condition specified in section 218.503, Florida Statutes, that determines a state of financial emergency;

(4) Ad valorem operating millage rate for the current fiscal year is greater than 8 mills; or

(5) A financial condition that is documented in annual financial statements at the end of the current fiscal year and indicates an inability to pay the permit processing fee during that fiscal year.

**WHEREAS**, these factors are supported by the attached documents;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the Town of Bronson does hereby request that the Suwannee River Water Management District reduce the processing fee for public purpose projects to a fee not to exceed \$100 per permit of the 2002 Fiscal Year.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida, that:



**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BRONSON, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING  
SUPPORT FOR THE CONTINUED INCLUSION OF A LOCAL SOURCES  
FIRST POLICY IN CHAPTER 373 FLORIDA STATUTES AND OPPOSITION  
TO ANY AMENDMENT TO FLORIDA'S WATER RESOURCE POLICY  
WHICH ALLOWS, ENCOURAGES OR PROMOTES WATER TRANSFERS.**

**WHEREAS**, Florida's water resources are a natural resource and not a commodity to be sold or transferred to the highest bidder; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida has been a staunch supporter of a State local sources first policy within Florida's Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida believes the continued retention of this policy is integral to protecting Florida's water resources and the development of long-term sustainable use without adversely impacting our unique natural resources; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida, unanimously agree with the Florida Association of Counties' support of the fundamental principles of Florida water law which requires a showing that a proposed use of water is a reasonable, beneficial use, will not interfere with an existing legal use of water, and is consistent with the public interest; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida supports the Florida Association of Counties; opposition to legislation that shifts water supply allocation from a publicly regulated process to a market driven process; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida supports the Florida Association of Counties' opposition to legislation that undermines the fundamental principles of Florida Water Law established a right-to-use not a right-of ownership.

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida has recently been informed that the Florida Council of 100 will request appeal or modification to Chapter 373 Florida Statutes to eliminate the local-sources first language; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida desires to go on record and unequivocally state that such a proposal is ill considered and will put Florida's surface waters and aquifers at risk or irreparable damage for irresponsible short-term gain by limited special interest groups; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida believes that any discussion of regional water transfer is premature until Minimum Flows and Levels have been established for all of Florida's water resources.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Town Council of the Town of Bronson, Florida as follows:

The Town Council actively oppose any modification to Chapter 373 Florida Statutes as it relates to the current local sources first policy and

The Town Council encourages all local governments and elected officials to voice their opposition to their state elected officials.
